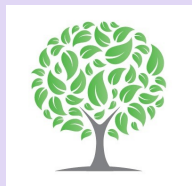

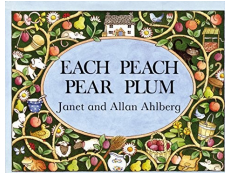

'Celebrating and Strengthening our Communities Together'

Our learning this half-term....



Each Peach Pear Plum

First we focused on a rhyming story to settle us back into Nursery School for the new year. The children explored the classic story 'Each Peach Pear Plum'. The children enjoyed searching the illustrations for clues about the characters before role playing a picnic in our groups.

Bird Watching

The following week was the start of the 'Big Garden Bird Watch'. We talked to the children about seeing birds in their garden and shared a tally chart for home enjoyment and participation. The children spent the next week learning all about birds, and creating birds in different forms including using paint or clay. We used our beautiful gardens again to 'bird watch' and we thought about what features a bird has and the names of the different birds we could find.



Winter

Our learning then progressed to looking carefully at our environment and landscape to spot the signs of winter. The children thoroughly enjoyed looking around the icy garden and noticed changes to our garden trees. We read the story 'Gruffalo's Child' to build on our previous knowledge of the Gruffalo. This story is set in a winter landscape and helped the children observe seasonal changes through visual story pictures too.

Lunar New Year

The children were curious to learn about how Lunar New Year is celebrated, and engaged in lots of cooking and arts to celebrate the occasion. We read key stories to support learning and on the Friday we performed some fun rhythmic songs to parents and carers and carried out our own dragon dance!



National Storytelling Week

During this week's learning the children shared 'Float', a wordless story, and added their own narrative to the story. Adults and children were authors by retelling and creating stories together and the children acted out some through 'Helicopter Stories' sessions.

The Gingerbread Man

We have made a great start to learning about traditional tales by sharing, retelling and acting out this story. This week the children have been baking or decorating their own gingerbread men and carrying out some specific 'oracy' (language) sessions talking about their ideas in a group.

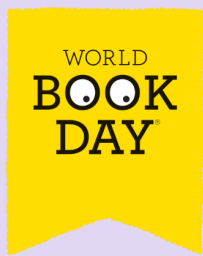

Leek & cheese scones

Makes 6 scones

- 1 leek (finely sliced)
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- Salt & pepper
- 250g wholemeal self-raising flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 60g unsalted butter (at room temperature)
- 80ml water
- 80g cheddar cheese
- 2 tbsp milk (to brush the top)

Preheat the oven to 200C/180c fan/6 gas mark.

Place the leek in a frying pan with olive oil and fry for 5 minutes, until soft.

In a large mixing bowl, add the flour, baking powder and a generous pinch of both salt and pepper.

Add the butter and use your fingertips to rub the ingredients together.

Mix in the cheddar and leeks, and water. Use your hands to bring the mixture together into a dough.

Cut the dough into scones using a glass or cutter and place on a lined baking tray.

Brush the scones with milk and bake for 20-25 minutes, or until golden brown and cooked through.
